The real fact is, that recent researches have shown the formations known as Gault and Upper Greensand each to consist of two divisions, but the lower part of the one being united palaeontologically with the upper member of the other, only three wellmarked groups can be established. Supposing, therefore, that the names of Gault and Upper Greensand are still retained, we must decide to which of the two this intermediate zone more probably belongs, whether in fact we should extend the Greensand downward or the Gault upward. I would advocate the latter measure, and the restriction of the term Upper Greensand to the group of beds containing a Warminster fauna; with regard to stage B, containing *Ex. conica* (the Upper Greensand of...



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
